Refugee 101

How do refugees come to the U.S.? Are they different from other immigrants? And why are they coming to Charlottesville? We'll talk about the refugee experience from home country to Charlottesville, how community members can support them as they adjust to life in their new home, and the opportunities and challenges that face the U.S. refugee resettlement program. The IRC enables refugees who are admitted to the United States to establish new lives and become self-sufficient, productive citizens who add to the vitality and promise of the nation.
