



A blood test can show if you have diabetes. If you do, you will need to take insulin for the rest of your life. A blood test called the A1C can check to see how well you are managing your diabetes.







Review and Update of Content on MedlinePlus







MedlinePlus provides health information from several different sources. Some pages, like the medical encyclopedia and drug information, are licensed from outside sources. Other pages, like health topic pages, medical tests, and genetic pages, are created for MedlinePlus. Information from different sources is reviewed and updated on different schedules.

Here's how information hosted on MedlinePlus is reviewed and updated:

Health Topics

- · Updated as new information becomes available.
- · Broken links are checked and fixed daily.
- A "Last updated" date indicates when the topic summary and/or the links on the page were reviewed and updated.

Medical Tests

- · Fully reviewed at least every 3 years.
- Content is also updated as needed between review cycles.
- A "last updated" date indicates when the medical test was reviewed and updated.

Genetics

- Condition, gene, and chromosome summaries, as well as sections of Help Me Understand Genetics, are reviewed by experts in genetics before being posted to MedlinePlus and with each substantial revision.
