What's Happening with Immigration?

AT RISK : People who are UNAUTHORIZED

13.7 million

1 in 20 of the U.S. workforce

62% have lived in the U.S. 10+ years

Parents to **6 million** U.S. citizen children

AT RISK : People losing Legal Protection

2 million - Asylum Seekers

654,000 - Temporary Protected Status

562,000 – DACA

521,000 - Humanitarian Parole

Three Steps to Deportation

1. ICE - Arrest and Detain

51,000+ in prison, 44% w/o criminal charges

2. Court Hearing (due process)

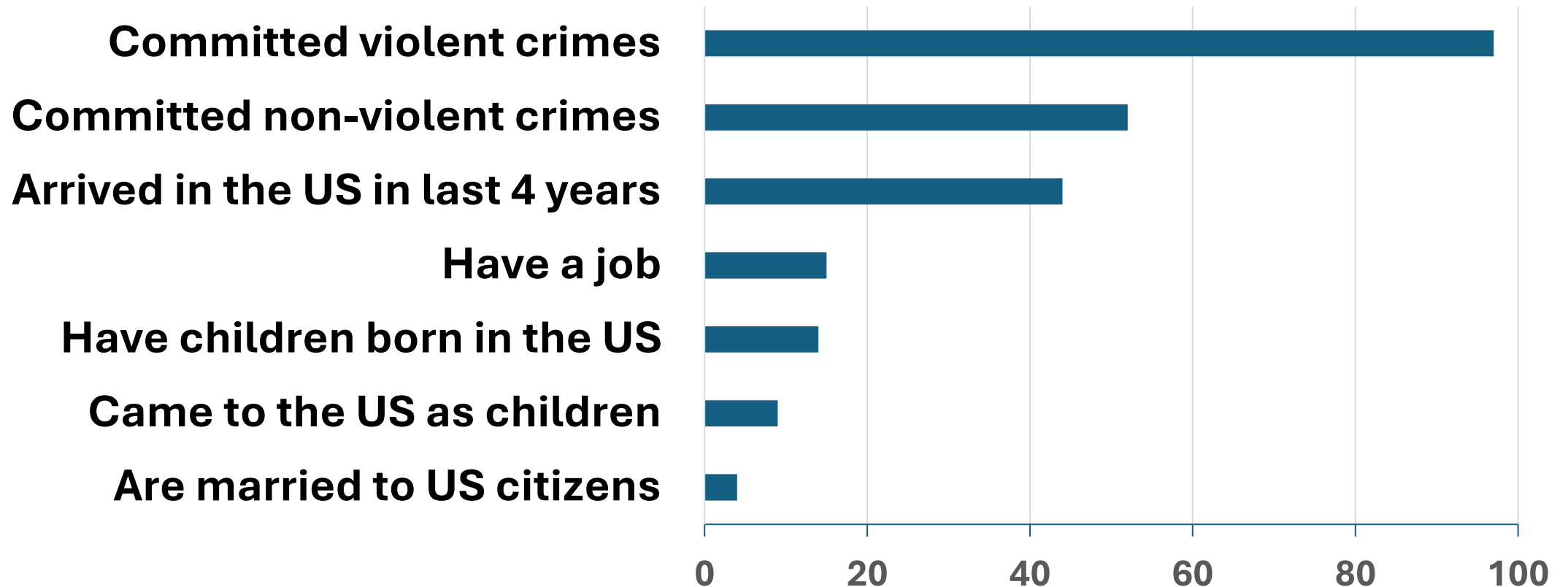
700 immigration judges, 70 courts

3. Deportation

Overland, Flights, Third Countries
