WORKFORCE INNOVATION AND OPPORTUNITIES ACT!



We serve: Charlottesville, Albemarle, Fluvanna, Greene, Louisa, and Nelson

WIOA is a government funded program that was created to help low wage income citizens receive the training, credentials, certifications, skills, or experience needed to get a higher wage paying job.

3 Ways to qualify for WIOA Eligibility

1. Low Income (below area poverty rate) determined by family size, yearly income, or SNAP recipient. SNAP recipients receive automatic approval. If you are employed, we use the last 6 months of pay stubs or last year's tax return for income determination.
2. Dislocated Worker (You are laid off from your job and not likely to return) and are receiving unemployment benefits.
3. Youth ages 16-24 with a barrier to employment or low income

Determination of Enrollment

- Eligibility
- Priority of Service (Ex: Veteran, Receiving SNAP benefits, Single Parent)
- Order of process
- Grant funds

Once enrollment is completed and you are an approved WIOA participant, the following services may be available to you:

- Financial assistance for training classes
- Paid Internships/Work Experience
- Supportive Services (mileage reimbursement, certification fees, work clothes/tools)
