


Numbers at a Glance

Student Demographics








Education Level




Volunteer Time

Growing Job Opportunities Through English

Literacy Volunteers' students made great gains in their occupational lives during fiscal year 2023. With 61 students improving employability and 41 entering the workforce or obtaining better employment, students understand that literacy is key to professional growth.

"Improving my English helped me a lot in my work, especially in communicating with clients in person or over the phone," wrote Karen. An architect in Syria, she now works as an architectural designer at a local firm. "The greatest credit for my English learning goes to LVCA. My tutor helped me learn correctly, obtain a clear and understandable accent, and also taught me a lot about American culture."

Mohammad has been a student at LVCA for nearly two years and has seen job opportunities open up

"step by step." Now, he works security at UVA Hospital and "feels good speaking at work." He credits the English he gained at LVCA to his tutor helping him. He said, "If you don't speak English, you don't get the job."

Paola, a student from Chile, wrote, "I knew improving English would help me in my work, but also in my day-to-day life. I have also been gaining more value in the eyes of my employers, family, and friends because there is an effort behind the growth." Literacy Volunteers recognizes this effort. We celebrate with our students as they continue to create new personal and professional paths for themselves in the Charlottesville community.
