





IRC CHARLOTTESVILLE

EDUCATION & YOUTH

Education and youth programs ensure families access education and support educators in maximizing student learning and family engagement. This includes ensuring that affordable, quality, culturally competent education and pre-primary education is available, and that children are supported, nourished, and ready to learn.

ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT

Economic empowerment programming provides our clients with the skills, resources, and opportunities needed to achieve financial independence and improve their quality of life. This includes career counseling, cash assistance, job placement, and skills training.

LEGAL

Legal programs increase access to asylum and other forms of legal protection while advocating for the rights of all migrants. This includes helping migrants complete applications for citizenship, family reunification, work authorization, hosting "Know Your Rights" workshops, and providing legal assistance.

RESETTLEMENT

Resettlement programs provide case management services to ensure our clients have basic needs during their initial resettlement period. This includes access to transportation and English classes among other services.

SAFETY & HEALTH

Safety & health programs support our clients' well-being and protection, helping them integrate safely into their new communities. This includes well-being workshops, ensuring access to quality food and health care, and working in healthy and safe environments.
