


# COVID-19 (3/8/21)

Total people that died from COVID: 186






### COVID-19 Numbers (3/8/21)

# **Community COVID Testing**

- Get a COVID-19 test
- Community testing sites are FREE for anyone: <u>https://www.vdh.virginia.go</u> <u>v/blue-ridge/covid-19-tjhd-t</u> <u>esting-sites/</u>
- Use the VDH <u>testing locator</u> to find other sites across Virginia



### **COVID CARE Support Services**

- You can ask for help if you get COVID-19 (a positive test)
- Support might include food and cleaning supplies delivered to your house or help paying your rent and bills
- Ask for help when the health department calls you ... or call 434-981-4103

# **COVID CARE** Support Services



If you receive a positive COVID test result and live in the City of Charlottesville or Albemarle and you will struggle with providing food, paying bills, or getting prescriptions/medication during the isolation period, LET US KNOW!

COVID Care is coordinated by Guitivate Charlottesville, City of Charlottesville, County of Albemarle, Blue Ridge Health District, and the UVA Equity Center. Support services are provided by the Blue Ridge Area Food Bank, Charlottesville Community Cares, City of Charlottesville Department of Human Services, Gultivate Charlottesville, Frontline Foods/Harvest Moon Catering/World Central Kitchen, Salvation Army, UVA Equity Center, and UVA Health.

#### **HOW TO REQUEST COVID CARE Support Services**

1) If you don't hear from the health department within 24 hours after receiving your positive results, reach out directly to our Care Resource Coordinator at 434-981-4103 via phone, text, or WhatsApp.

Tell the person you speak with that you could use support to safely stay at home

With your consent, the health department can automatically refer you to support services.





### Where can you get the vaccine?



- Seminole Square (UVA)
- Kmart tent (BRHD)
- Walmart (not all locations)
- CVS (not all locations)
- Blue Ridge Medical Center (Nelson)

- A community-based clinic
- A clinic for refugees
- A clinic for Spanish-speakers
- An on-site clinic for people that live in public housing or senior living



# What will your appointment be like? It all depends on where you get vaccinated!

#### • Q: How long does it take?

- A: The appointment itself is <u>usually</u> pretty fast
- ~30 minutes (check-in, vaccination, 15 minutes post-observation)
- However, times can vary depending on where you go and what's going on that day

#### • Q: Can I bring someone with me?

- A: usually no; unless you have a caregiver
  - There is a question on the pre-registration where you can input contact information for a designated caregiver



### What will your appointment be like?

# • Q: do I need to have insurance?

- **A:** No, BRHD/UVA won't ask or screen for insurance
- However, it's possible you may be asked to show an insurance card elsewhere (like a pharmacy or doctor's office)

# It all depends on where you get vaccinated!

### • Q: Do I need Photo ID?

- A: Always a good idea to bring your best available ID (driver's license, passport, photo ID from another country)
- However, you can still get vaccinated if you don't have one
- Q: do I need to have a social security number or be a citizen?
  - **A:** No, vaccine is available to everyone and is FREE to all.
