LVCA RESOURCES:

<u>Conversation Scripts</u> - These conversation scripts are meant for two people. These scripts include reading vocabulary from the reading test, which is underlined, and all 100 civics questions. Under each script are the civics questions from the master USCIS list that the script includes. The first script is shorter and easier, and they progressively get longer and harder.

Topics Covered: Civics, reading

Tutor tips: In class, use this resource as a classroom activity and practice.

- Person B often asks the questions, so you can perform this part and have students answer the questions, similar to what the civics test will be
- Ask students the questions covered in the script after reading the script to test their civics knowledge and reading comprehension
- · Go over words that the student has trouble reading

Why we like it: These conversation scripts help your students practice speaking and conversation skills, answering civics questions, and reading citizenship vocabulary.

<u>Reading and Writing Passages</u> - These reading and writing passages include all of the reading and writing vocabulary that your student could be tested on during the citizenship test. Under each topic is two passages. The top passage has reading vocabulary, and the bottom passage has writing vocabulary.

Tutor tips: In class, use this resource as a <u>classroom activity</u> and <u>practice</u>.

- Have your student read the top passage, then you read the bottom passage to your student and have them write down what they hear
- · Go over words that the student has trouble reading and writing

Why we like it: You do not have to go through the effort of making your sentences, and the reading and writing vocabulary your student needs to know are all underlined so they can practice words they are having trouble with.
