Focused on business use	Focused consumer/personal use
Host needs Zoom account (free)	Host needs a Google account (free)
40 minute time limit for groups (time restrictions lifted, for now)	60 minute time limit (24 hours until Sept. 30)
Must download initial software	No download requirements
Use website to schedule meetings	Can schedule right in Google calendar
Send invites by copying URL from website and then paste it into an email	Invites can be sent directly through the Google calendar
More advanced features – annotations, whiteboard, etc.	Simple video calling solution with basic features
No captions	Closed captions provided but not always reliable
Better for groups: raise hand, vote yes/no, "reactions", individual messages, breakout rooms	Better for one-on-one, simple conversations
Screen share with whiteboard and annotations	Basic screen sharing only
